This is my first feedback to the public records you provided me per my request of May 29, 2007 for ALL records held by the Attorney General's Office concerning Leader Technologies Incorporated.

Perhaps what was most obvious were the documents that were NOT provided that, in my opinion, would be have been public records IF the Attorney General's office did in fact have the records.

First, there were NO records provided that the AG's office has ever made any attempt to contact or collect from Leader Technologies the **Bureau of Worker's Compensation Judgement dated August 24, 2004 in the amount of \$2,065.** The Franklin County Court of Common Pleas shows this as still active as of this date.

Second, there is no public information that represents anything more than the information contained in the Grant Agreement that was signed by Leader corporate officers. There is no public information that evidences Leader was enticed to sign an agreement based on promises of other forthcoming monies not specified in the Grant Agreement.

Third, and now of probing importance, there were NO public records provided to me that show Leader Technologies Incorporated or Leader's legal counsel ever submitted a written request for public documents about themselves to either the ODOD or the Attorney General's Office. **Mr. Donchatz testified in the Sanctions Hearing in my case (see page 34) that the ODOD and the AG both DENIED their request for public documents concerning their business relationship.** It would seem to me that the next prudent action on Mr. Donchatz's part would have been to make an immediate written request to both the ODOD and the AG asking for the public documents to ensure the attempt was documented and they were making every effort to comply with court orders.

While the **Attorney General's office has embarrassed itself by stumbling, fumbling,** and taking eight months to respond to my May 29, 2007 request for public documents, I want to be crystal clear that the Ohio Department of Development (through Mr. Robert P. Stempfer and previously Ms. Marlo B. Tannous) has been **crisp, flawless, and timely in their response to each and every request for public documents I have made.** Of course, I would never know that anything was missing; however, I believe they have been thorough. **It certainly mystifies me why I got public records so easily while Leader's counsel was refused the same information.**

I will let the attached public record transcript of the Sanction Hearing in my lawsuit against Leader Technologies Incorporated speak for itself. **It is provided in its entirety to ensure that nothing is presented out of context. I believe this will greatly enlighten the ODOD and the AG to Leader's credibility and tactics.**

I think it is obvious that before the Attorney Generals' Office settles for thirty-two cents on the dollar on behalf of their client ODOD, proof should be demanded concerning the records and the existence (or non-existence) of critical information Leader has provided the ODOD and the Attorney General's Office supporting any of Leader's claims.
